why they don't treat their hearing loss, price is often the primary answer. A 2016 report by the White House stated the average price of a *single* hearing aid is \$2,300. With most people needing a pair (driving that total up to nearly \$5,000), it's easy to see why so many people are putting off addressing their hearing loss.

So why is it that hearing aids still cost several thousands of dollars, when the cost of other electronics such as computers and flat screen TVs have come down in price over time? In this report, we'll look into what's driving these expensive prices and a new way to buy hearing aids that is saving people a lot of money.

What's Driving the High Cost?

Part of the answer is that a small group of manufacturers control the majority of the hearing aid market and can set the price. They mark up hearing aids anywhere from 200% to 400% depending on features, and they only sell to retail hearing clinics, never directly to you.


On top of the manufacturer's markup, retail clinics then charge you for the audiologist's or dispenser's time, expertise, rent, licenses, and profit—often thousands of dollars.

Not only are hearing aids expensive when bought this traditional way, but that price tag doesn't factor in the time, or hidden costs, required from you. Fitting appointments and follow-up adjustments can last anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour, not including your commute or time spent in a waiting room.
